Re: Petition to Ban Sulfuric Acid Drain Openers HP 04-2

Dear Mr. Stevenson:

I have received a copy of the Staff's recommendation to deny the subject petition.

It is just my opinion, but appears that the Staff is still making the same errors in logic as before. If indeed the Staff believes that sulfuric acid drain openers (SADOs) do not present any more danger than alkaline drain openers (ALKDOs), then am I to assume that one of the Staff Members will accept my public challenge?

Recall that the public challenge is that one of the CPSC Staff Members will appear with me in public and at the same time that I pour one of the conventional ALKDOs on my bare arm, he or she will pour the concentrated SADO on their arm. The challenge is to see who runs for the water first and who will end up with the most severe burns.

Please note that Good Morning America has showed an interest in this petition and I would expect that they would welcome this public demonstration.

If there is no CPSC Staff Member who will step forward to accept the challenge, then their actions speak louder than their words.

Who will accept the challenge? Will you?
